2017 Year: Overview

This is the first year for Culture Chats BC Association as an incorporated not-for-profit society in BC. We were incorporated in January 2017. We were an informal community group operating since about two years before incorporating. We were running two book clubs and we had organized activities such as writing workshop, author talks and a cultural dialogue. This has been part of our vision to be a collaborative hub for local community members from all cultures to engage with, experience and enjoy literary and other arts in new and innovative ways. This year we expanded the scale of our events by planning a community festival spanning over three days and managed to secure small amount of funds for the event.

Total revenues amounted to \$2,033 and our total expenses for the year amounted to \$2008.26 as of mid-November 2017. The balance after deducting additional bank charges and service charges for the rest of the year amounts to \$24.74. Our AGM was held on December 14, 2017 and the Financial Report was shared during the AGM.

We rely on volunteers for supporting our work. This year over 276 hours of volunteering support helped for our event. We aim to secure more funding and expand our volunteer base for next year. We are very grateful for the support of our partners and sponsors.

2017 Programs

Intercultural Community Reading Festival:

We organized a three day Community Reading Festival in October 2017 at the Tommy Douglas Library in Burnaby. Details are available in the 'Past Events' section on our Events Page.
