Programs and Events in 2022

Writing Program



Culture Chats received funding from IRCC to conduct writing workshops and to organize reading events to share the stories written by participants. Throughout Summer starting end of May 2022 writing workshops were conducted between until end of August 2022. Two sharing events were organized on July 01 and Nov 27. Podcasting workshops were conducted in September and October. Participants will be invited to join Culture Chats at the Stride Festival. The workshops were conducted online due to the Covid 19 pandemic, but the reading events were organized in person. We were fortunate to receive additional funding to record podcasts and digital files of the stories from IRCC. We worked with two podcasting consultants and podcasts are uploaded on our youtube channel.

We also participated in a neighbourhood event in August 2022 with the Burnaby Neighbourhood House and participants got an opportunity to read their published stories to children and families at a summer barbeque.

The Program will be completed by end of March 2023. Written stories of the participants will be published, and podcast as well as video files are shared on youtube. These links will also be shared into the wider community by our community partners Literacy Now and New2BC. Culture Chats has actively connected with community organizations with a view to organize suitable community engagement opportunities from these partnerships..

BC Multiculturalism Week Nov

On Nov 27 2022 Culture Chats organized a multicultural craft and stories event to celebrate BC Multiculturalism week. With support from local community and organizations such as South Burnaby Neighbourhood House, Literacy Now and BIPT, the event invited community artists to set up display booths. Multicultural art and craft activities for children were planned such as Chinese calligraphy, Jewish Hanukkah crafts, Christmas decoration creations and other. Participants from the Culture Chats writing workshops read their stories at the event and along with oriental musical performance it was a very entertaining event. This was free and open to all in community organized with a grant from Festivals Burnaby and funding from the Government of Canada.

We are thankful for collaborations with various community partners including Burnaby Neighbourhood House, BIPT, Literacy Now and Burnaby Festival of Learning.

Operations

Culture Chats benefits from counsel and support of Directors Craita Isbasescu, Lawrence Francois, Shokoofeh Mostofi and Asmita Lawrence also serves as the Executive Director. We have served over hundred clients in this year through our arts and craft events and workshops and our writing workshops and dance workshops. The presentations and online publishing of participants' works reached a much wider audience. Our annual revenue amounted to \$50034, and our annual expenditure amounted to about \$45330 with the bulk of the remaining funds restricted for the IRCC project to be completed by March 2023. Our annual AGM was held on Dec 18, 2022.
